Neskowin Preparedness Plan Tillamook County, Oregon

Earthquake/Tsunami

Goal: Enhance the safety of residents and visitors should a natural disaster occur.

Method: Education, training and communication to achieve both community awareness and support.

Objectives:

- 1. Provide direction to Neskowin area residents and visitors should a tsunami and/or earthquake occur.
- 2. Educate residents regarding this plan and the use of emergency notification systems, such as sirens and NOAA radios.
- 3. Develop and implement a comprehensive plan for response and evacuation, outlining methods of short and long-term survival.
- 4. Develop a hazard analysis and risk factors for other emergencies, which could affect the Neskowin area.

Local Earthquake/Tsunami

Ground shaking and/or ocean recedes—you have 12-30 minutes to walk to high ground.

Evacuation:

- 1. Do not delay.
- 2. Do not wait for official warning (sirens may not work).
- 3. Do not call 911.
- 4. Do not pack—take Emergency Kit.
- 5. Waves may last 12 hours, stay on high ground. Caution—trees, power lines, and bridges may be down.
- 6. Know the location of the Safe Assembly areas.

Safe Assembly Areas

(one mile inland, 80-100 foot elevation)


Proposal rock, South Beach, RV Park – to Ocean Ridge or up dirt road behind RV Park

<u>Neskowin</u> – to Hawk Creek Hills or Neskowin Crest

North Beach – to Neskowin Crest

<u>Slab Creek</u> – to high ground or one mile inland

<u>Sahhali Shores</u> – move to high ground by condos



Local Earthquake Tsunami

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- 3. Do not call 911

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- 4. Do not pack take Emergency Kit
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- 6. Know the location of Safe Assembly areas.

Safe Assembly Areas

(one mile inland, 80 to 100 foot elevation)

Proposal Rock, South Beach, <u>RV Park</u> to Ocean Ridge or up dirt road behind RV Park

Neskowin - to Hawk creek Hills or Neskowin Crest

North Beach - to Neskowin Crest

Slab Creek - to high ground or one-mile inland

Sahhali Shores - move to high ground by condos

Distant Earthquake Tsunami

3-minute siren or NOAA radio alert - (1 to 4 hours to evacuate) walk or drive to high ground or one mile inland

72 Hour Emergency Preparedness Kit:

Storing emergency supplies before a disaster can add to your family's safety and comfort during a disaster. You should store enough supplies for at least 72 hours.

- First Aid Kit and reference guide
- Water _- ': gaL Drinking water per person per day
- Food (packaged, canned, no-cook Items, candy, special diet needs)
- Can Opener (non-electric)
- Blankets or sleeping bags
- Fire Extinguisher (A-B-C type)
- Essential medications a~nd eyeglasses
- Money _change for a pay phone
- Portable radio, flashlights, batteries, cell phone
- Alternate cooking source and matches
- Clothing _heavy gloves and sturdy shoes
- Spare keys _insurance #, company name and phone number
- Crescent wrench (12 or longer for utility shut off)

Recommendations for Car Kit;

- Blankets or sleeping bags
- Booster cables, tools, flares, flashlights and batteries
- Bottles water
- Canned fruits and nuts with can opener
- First Aid Kit and Red Cross Guide
- Candles and matches (water proof)
- Rain gear, walking shoes, hat, gloves, clothing
